Overview of Access Layer Switches

Access layer switches operate at the edge of the network, providing connectivity for end devices such as PCs, IP phones, printers, and wireless access points. Their main role is to grant network access while enforcing security and traffic management policies. They are typically deployed in Layer 2 mode, although some support limited Layer 3 functionality for routing between VLANs.

Common Types of Access Layer Switches

- Layer 2 (L2) Switches
 - Forward traffic based on MAC addresses within the same VLAN.
 - Cost-effective and ideal for small to medium networks.
 - Support VLAN segmentation, link aggregation, and Spanning Tree Protocol (STP) for loop prevention.
- Layer 2+ or Multilayer Switches
 - Provide Layer 2 switching with limited Layer 3 routing capabilities.
 - Useful for networks that require inter-VLAN routing at the access layer without deploying full Layer 3 switches.
