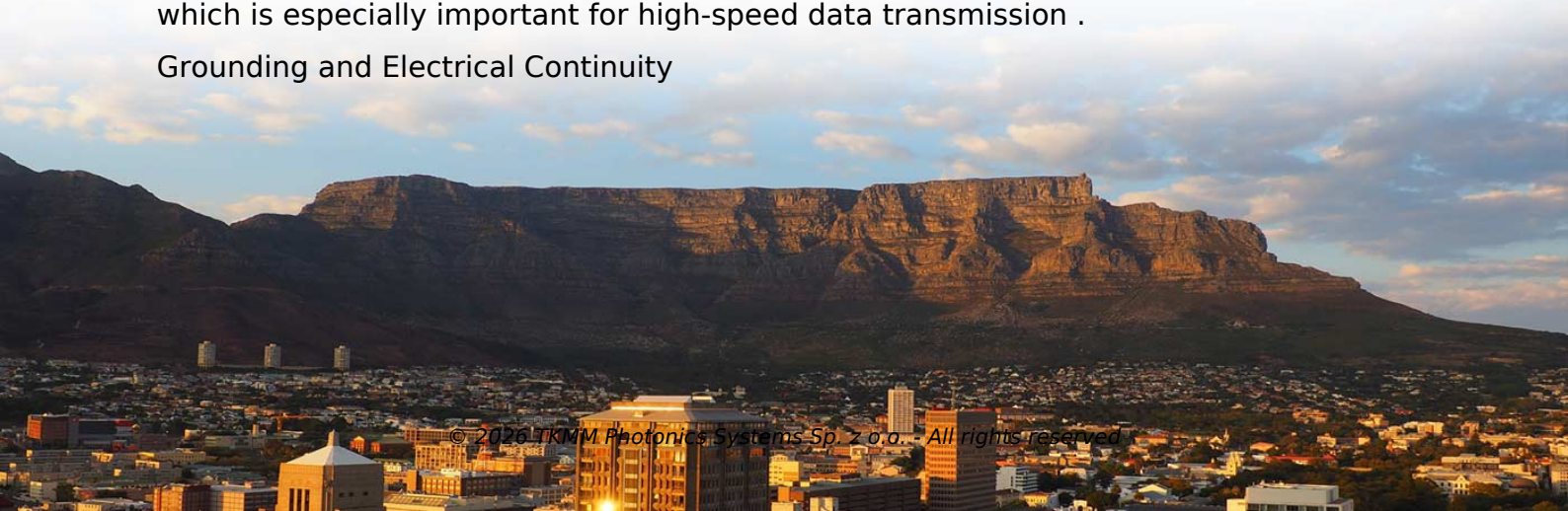
Inspection and Cleaning

High-speed cable trays should be inspected periodically for physical damage, corrosion, loose fittings, or signs of overheating. Ventilated trays must be kept free of dust, debris, and obstructions to maintain airflow and prevent heat buildup, which is critical for high-speed data cables that are sensitive to temperature variations. Solid-bottom trays should be checked for moisture accumulation or chemical exposure that could degrade insulation.

Load Management

Ensure that the tray fill does not exceed the maximum allowable cross-sectional area: typically 40% for power cables and 50% for control or data cables. Overloading can cause mechanical stress, sagging, or overheating. Maintain proper spacing between high-power and low-power cables to prevent electromagnetic interference (EMI), which is especially important for high-speed data transmission.
