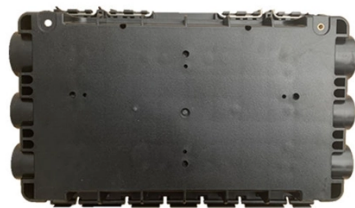


Is the cold aisle in the computer room a micro-module

Abbreviated as micro-module, it is a small rack cluster formed by a certain number of two rows of back-to-back or face-to-face IT racks, uninterruptible power supply, near-end cooling equipment and so on through closed aisle. The modular cold aisle system is a core component of the micro-module data center, specially designed to meet the development needs of cloud computing, virtualization, centralization, and high-density servers. Modular datacenters deploy hot and cold aisles and use in-row cooling units. When implemented correctly, they improve efficiency, reduce energy consumption, extend equipment life, and enhance overall reliability. According to the ANSI/TIA/EIA-942-A standard, the recommended width for a cold aisle is 1,2 meters, which typically corresponds to the size of two double floor tiles.
