

Safe Current for Secondary Distribution Boxes on Construction Sites



AI Overview

Secondary distribution boxes on construction sites should be rated for the maximum anticipated load, protected by appropriate breakers, and installed in rugged, weather-resistant enclosures to ensure safe operation.

Load and Current Rating

Secondary distribution boxes must be sized according to the maximum expected load, including continuous and peak currents from lighting, power tools, and machinery. Typical construction sites use three-phase 400 V systems for heavy equipment and single-phase 230 V for smaller tools. The box should have a current rating higher than the sum of connected loads to prevent overheating and allow for future expansion or temporary peak loads . Conductors feeding the box must also be rated for the expected current, following NEC Article 310 guidelines .

Protection Devices

Each secondary distribution box should include circuit breakers or fuses to protect against overloads and short circuits. For motor-driven equipment, disconnects should isolate both the motor and controller, and be visible from the controller location . Ground fault protection is essential to prevent electrocution, especially in wet or outdoor conditions.
