Additionally, Fibre Channel over Ethernet (FCoE) encapsulates Fibre Channel traffic over standard Ethernet networks, providing flexibility in deployment. In summary, Fibre Channel can be referred to as Fiber Channel, FC, GFC, and is closely associated with protocols like FCP, FICON, and FCoE, depending on the context of use and the physical or logical implementation.
