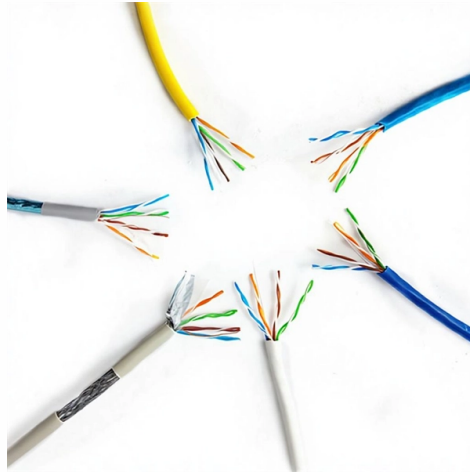


Wind Farms in Malaysia

Malaysia currently has minimal wind energy development, with potential largely untapped due to low wind speeds and limited infrastructure, though offshore opportunities are being explored.

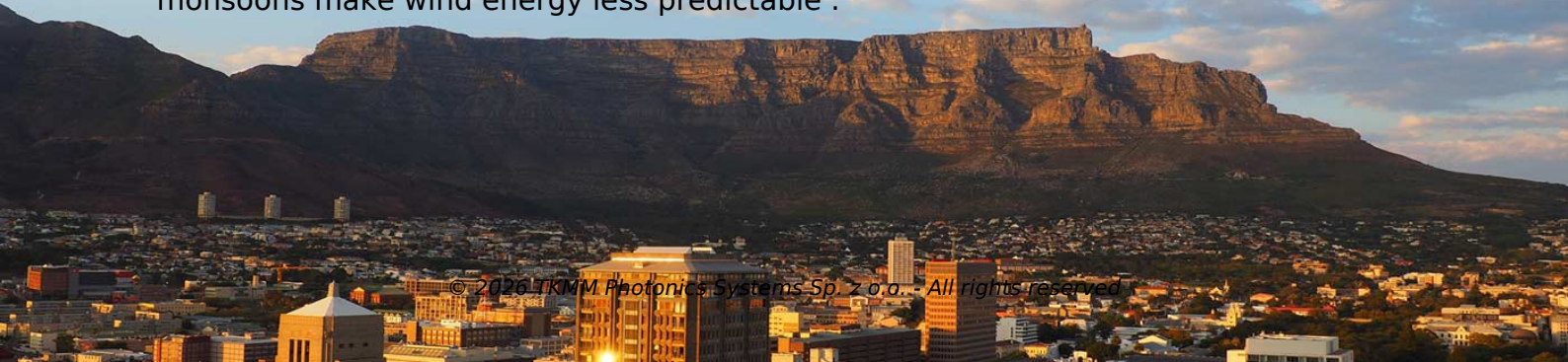
Current Status of Wind Energy

Malaysia's wind energy sector is still in its infancy. As of 2021, the country's installed wind power capacity is virtually negligible, contributing 0% to the national energy mix, with only small-scale turbines like the 150 kW unit in Bukit Cerakah, Selangor, installed for research and demonstration purposes . Onshore wind projects have not yet been executed for large-scale electricity generation, and the total exploitable capacity is estimated at 1.4 GW, which is modest compared to solar (1.9 GW) and hydropower (6.4 GW), .

Challenges for Wind Farm Development

The main challenges for wind energy in Malaysia include:

- Low average wind speeds: The country-wide annual average is around 1.8 m/s, below the 4 m/s threshold for small turbines and 5.8 m/s for utility-scale turbines .
- Geographical limitations: Peninsular Malaysia lacks open plains or elevated areas with consistently high wind speeds, and coastal areas suitable for wind farms are often populated .
- Inconsistent wind patterns: Seasonal variations due to southwest and northeast monsoons make wind energy less predictable .
